VACATION PARKING IN THE FAIRWAYS

TERMINIX TERMITE PREVENTION

The Association has contracted with TERMINIX pest control to monitor the termite activity throughout the community. Outside of many residences you will find orange wooden stakes in the ground. They are provided by TERMINIX, and are used to measure termite activity. The TERMINIX representative recently reported that over 20 stakes have been removed throughout the community. If an orange TERMINIX stake is in the ground near or around your unit, please leave it there.

PETS AND THEIR OWNERS

Reminders: 1) always keep your pet on a leash when outdoors; 2) never tether your pet outside, nor leave a tether staked in the ground or fastened around a tree, bush, lamp post, rail, etc.; 3) always pick up and properly dispose of pet waste. Pet wastet bags are not to be store outside units.

PREVENT BIRD COLLISIONS

Worldwide, window collisions kill close to a billion birds every year. You can reduce the collisions and save a bird:

- Place bird feeders within 3 feet of a window so visiting birds cannot get up enough speed to hurt themselves.
- Draw lines, squiggles, or patterns on a window with soap or a window paint marker (~\$5.00).
- Place vertical masking tape, electrical tape strips, or ABC BirdTape on windows, www.abcbirdtape.org.
- Purchase or make your own window gel clings
- Purchase WindowAlert(www.windowalert.com) , a window decal that contains a component which reflects ultraviolet sunlight, is invisible to humans, but glows like a stop-light for birds,
- Draw blinds and move indoor plants away from windows.
- Install Collidescape (www.collidescape.org) a window film that looks opaque from the outside, but allows views out.
- Install unobtrusive netting in front of window. Bird B Gone (birdbegone.com) has several types for glass windows and facades.
