

## Architectural Regulations

### Garage Doors

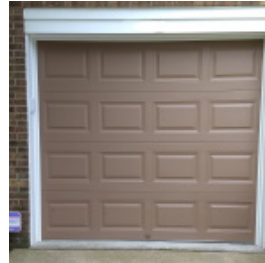
**The original garage door is no longer available.** There is one approved style door for **all** units. Several companies make doors in the approved style:

**Brick Unit** garage doors are to be painted

Sherwin Williams 7510 – Chateau Brown

**Vinyl Unit** garage doors are to be painted

Sherwin Williams 6088 - Nuthatch



### Front Doors

***Front Door Paint Colors:*** *The following colors represent the only “Approved” exterior colors permitted within the Fairways. Unit owners wishing to change to a different “approved” front door color must first fill out and submit to Acri a “request for change” form, and wait for a letter of approval or denial before proceeding with any color change. The exact approved shade is the Sherwin Williams paint number. The information in parentheses is just to give people a rough description and is not official.*

#### **Colors Approved for Front Doors on All Units –Brick or Vinyl**

Sherwin Williams 6672 – Morning Sun (light yellow)

Sherwin Williams 6086 – Sand Dune (medium tan)

Sherwin Williams 6150 – Universal Khaki (greenish tan shade)

Sherwin Williams 7510 – Chateau Brown (dark brown shade)

Sherwin Williams 7585 – Sun Dried Tomato (red shade)

Sherwin Williams 7673 – Pewter Cast (a gray shade)

Sherwin Williams 6515 - Leisure Blue (medium light blue shade)

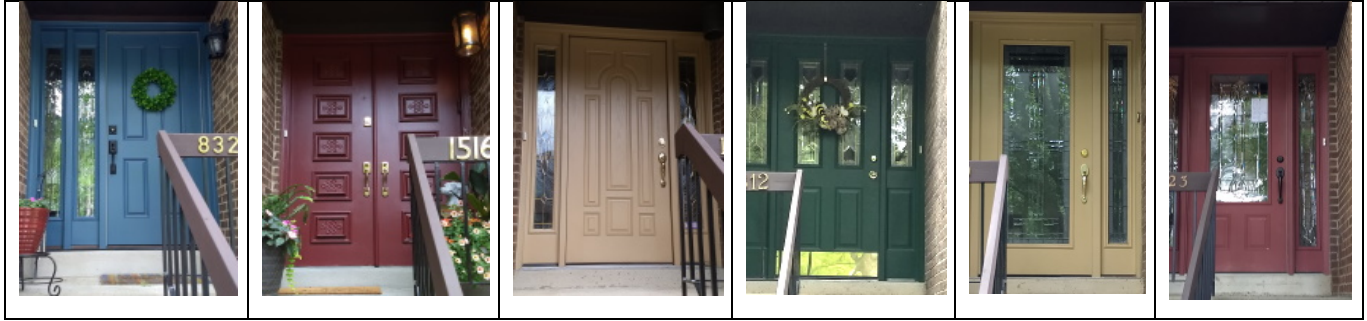
Sherwin Williams 6244 – Naval (navy blue)

Sherwin Williams 6550 – Mythical (a lavender shade)

Sherwin Williams 6446 – Arugula (a medium dark true green)

#### **Brick Unit Door Styles**

Entry doors may be double or single. All styles approved for vinyl are also approved here PLUS Those meeting the following criteria: Glass in the doors should appropriately match glass in fixed sidelights. All have either raised or embossed panels similar to those in the approved doors for the vinyl units. The glass may be full or partial. See the examples below.



**Trim**

Gutters, downspouts, soffit and fascia are painted dark brown

**Screen and Storm Doors**

Screen or storm doors shall be full view and match the color of the exterior door. An earlier council approved storms in a dark brown for all brick units.

**Entry Door Styles** - Note that the half panel glass door may omit the interior pane dividers



**Awnings**



*Before ordering an awning, submit the exterior change form to the council along with a color swatch.*

**Brick Units:** Awnings on brick units are to be either solid or wide-striped burgundy

**Vinyl Units** As of 2018 Awnings on vinyl-sided units are to be Sunbrella Bronze or essentially identical. Older awnings already installed are permissible until they need replacement, at which time the replacement should meet the new standard.

**Exterior Lighting** – *Exterior lighting is the responsibility of the association. Owners shall not replace exterior light fixtures without approval of council. Report broken fixtures to Acri Management using the Maintenance Form (continued next page)*



**House numbering** is an Association responsibility. Owners shall not change or replace the numbering on either the unit or mail box post. The numbers on the mailboxes are uniform throughout the association and were chosen because they are reflective and thus help police, fire and emergency responders find an address. If a number is broken, or missing, use the maintenance form to report this.

**Mailboxes and posts** are also an Association responsibility. Owners may make no changes.
